In the name of providing job and introducing husband, Zhang Jianke in Ma Bu Kou county cheated several naive girls from Yunnan province to Woyang County in Anhui and sold them for ¥19,000 to ¥24,000 to the local young men who were desperately searching for wives. As the process of the advanced detection, the inter-regional women trafficking case were out of shadow.

As soon as getting the message from other residents on September 6, around 10pm, local police reached Zhang's home, and rescued a woman from Yunnan named Lan and arrested Zhang, who had confessed with the case which was till under processing by present.

Lately, police of Cao county got a resident report and uncovered a broad-cross trafficking in women and children. This peccant band had a very rigorous discipline, and had already trafficked 5 women and 2 children to Cao County within two years. Recently three suspects were arrested. The persons trafficked mainly came from Yunnan, Myanmar and Vietnam, and the oldest woman was 60.

At present, in one hand the local police were connecting with Yunnan and in the other hand were detecting intensively other principals there, sniffing of criminal's track and at the same time helping two children and two women back home.

A number of children were lost reported in China every year. Most of the parents who were lost child thought their kids were not strayed but trafficked. Although they exerted to, the speed of rescuing children would never catch up with that of lost ones.

"Searching kids poker" was a way for the desperate parents. During Iraq war, American corps used the poker to hue the interior of Saddam, two years later, a resident of Anhui named Shen Hao got enlightened from it, on August 1st, 2006, the first 10,000 "searching kids pokers" arrived at the Shen home.

27 kids' pictures of 26 families were made, from "Ace" to "King", along with "searching" press. Each family paid for 600 Yuan for it.

They merely expected that these pokers could reach remote area, bring about clues and rescue more kids.

近日,曹县公安局工业园区派出所接群众举报破获一重大跨国贩买妇女儿童案,该团伙分工细致组织严密,3年内把5名妇女和2名儿童贩买到曹县。目前,三名犯罪嫌疑人已被曹县警方抓获。被拐卖者来自我国云南和缅甸、越南等国,年龄最大的妇女已经60岁。

目前警方正在和云南警方联系,加紧调查另外几名云南作案主谋的行踪,同时也在寻找已找到的两名妇女和两名儿童的家乡。

中国每年记录在案的失踪儿童数以千计。绝大多数家长不认为孩子是自己走失的,他们怀疑被人骗拐。尽管他们施尽浑身解数,儿童被解救回来的速度仍远不及失踪的速度。

"寻子扑克"是一些家长绝望下的尝试。2003年的伊拉克战争中,美军曾通过扑克牌通缉萨达姆的部属,两年后,一个叫沈浩的安徽滁州人从中获得了灵感,开始寻访失踪儿童家庭。2006年8月1日,第一批10000副"寻子扑克"运抵沈家。

26个家庭的27个孩子,率先成为这副暗红色、印着"寻"字扑克牌中的"A"到"K",每个家庭为此付出了600元的费用。

他们只有一个愿望:希望寻子扑克能够流传到收买儿童量大的偏远贫困地区,从 而带出被拐卖儿童的信息,解救更多的孩子。
