Vietnam and Australia co-operate in fight against human trafficking

Australia will provide the Vietnamese Border Defence Command with facilities for two rooms for checking passports and other papers. Colonel Hien the Deputy Commander of the Border Defence Force expressed thanks to the Australian Government and Ministry of Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs for providing the facilities with the aim of sharing experiences and professional capability in controlling border areas and migration activities, combating trafficking in humans and related crimes, and boosting international co-operation in the fight against terrorism. The Ambassador expressed wishes for more opportunities to expand co-operation in the fight against human trafficking.

South Korea edging out Japan in women trafficking--NGO

South Korea is edging out Japan as the new destination of Filipino trafficked women, most of whom are forced into sex trade, a woman rights advocate revealed. Carmelita Nuqui, executive director of the Development Action for Women (DAWN), said some 3,000 to 4,000 Filipino entertainers work around the 50 American military bases in South Korea. "They (women entertainers in Korea) enter using valid entertainer visas. They are forced to perform work beyond singing and dancing," said Nuqui at a forum of the Philippine Migrants Rights Watch on Wednesday. "Their employers -- the club owners and managers -- confiscate their passports and alien registration cards to ensure that the women do not run away," Nuqui said. A portion of their salary is withheld, "forcing them to supplement their income by engaging in other activities, including sexual services," she said.

Vietnamese trafficked into China for prostitution

Over the last few years criminals in the border areas in Guangxi have adopted many methods to traffic Vietnamese women into China. In 2005, China and Vietnam launched a joint campaign over two months, and over 100 Vietnamese women were rescued and repatriated. One of them was a 19 year

old girl called Ruan Shihua. In June 2005 she went to Dongxing city in Guangxi for a relative's wedding. Afterwards, five men who were pretending to be police came to the house to check documents, and as she did not enter China legally and did not have any identification, she was taken away. In the course of investigating a prostitution case, the police not only successfully rescued Ruan and apprehended two suspects (one Vietnamese and one Chinese), but also rescued another 10 Vietnamese women trafficked into China for prostitution.

A 34 year old woman who was trafficked to Pianyuanshan village 15 years ago was finally able to return home. In 1990, she and a friend travelled to Beijing, but they were separated from each other when she went to use the railway bathroom. When she exited the bathroom, a man approached her and offered to help her find her friend. After she had drunk some water that the man had given her she started to feel very confused and lost consciousness. She remembers awaking to hear the man who had offered her the drink and another man discussing the price for her. It was then that she realised she was being trafficked.

A 'trafficking village' becomes a model village

Mi'er village was for many years known as a 'trafficking village': from 2000 until 2003, 12 women and two children were trafficked, and 11 people were punished for trafficking. However over the last few years, activities on prevention and elimination of trafficking have been conducted in this village. These activities have changed the ideas of the villagers, whilst also enhancing the women and children's consciousness on the issues of rights protection, gender, laws, and prevention. Since the commencement of these activities, there have been no trafficking cases in Mi'er village: fulfilling the dual objectives of having no-one trafficked and having no traffickers in the village.

Hebei Police try to identify four rescued trafficked children

On November 15th of this year the Pingxiang County Police in Hebei Province uncovered a child trafficking case, and rescued four children aged between three and five years old. However, the Pingxiang police were confronted with a problem: as these children were trafficked so long ago, the children themselves were unable to describe where they were originally from. Yesterday, the Hebei police and a journalist from the *Xi'an Evening Paper* met in the hope that they could work together to try to find the parents of these children. The Hebei police could not rule out that these children may be from Yunnan Province.

一个妇女权利倡议者揭露说,韩国正在替代日本成为菲籍妇女被拐卖后的目的国,她们中的大部分被强迫从事性交易。妇女发展行动组织执行干事 Carmelita Nuqui 说,大约 3000 到 4000 名菲律宾娱乐服务人员工作在韩国约 50 个美军基地中。她在周三举行的"菲律宾移民权利保护"论坛上说: "她们(韩国的女性娱乐服务人员)通过有效的娱乐服务人员签证入境。她们被逼从事唱歌、跳舞之外的工作。"她说: "她们的雇主,即娱乐场所的业主和管理者扣押了

她们的护照和外籍人登记卡,以确保她们不会逃跑";她们的一部分薪水被截留,"以强迫她们通过其他活动,包括提供性服务来填补收入。"

越南百名女子被拐卖到中国境内卖淫

近年来,在广西边境地区,犯罪分子采取各种手段将越南妇女拐卖到中国。2005年,中国和越南警方联合开展了为期两个月的解救行动,已有100多名被拐越南妇女被遣返回国。19岁的阮氏花是这次被解救的越南妇女之一。2005年6月,她到已嫁到广西东兴市的堂姐家玩,没想到却被几名人贩子从家中拐走,原来,有5人冒充公安去查房,以没有办入境合法手续、没有身份证为由将她带走。报案后经过在一卖淫点搜查,警方不仅成功解救出了阮氏花,还抓获了两名犯罪嫌疑人—越南籍犯罪嫌疑人林氏凤和中国的梁勇,同时解救出10多名都是十几岁的被拐妇女,被人贩子拐卖到这里准备从事卖淫活动。

"拐卖村"成了先进村
