Sex-trafficked victims in Glasgow to be offered refuge

The Home Office has given Glasgow City Council special dispensation from usual immigration rules, even though the move contradicts current Home Office policy. Trafficking victims discovered during raids on brothels in Glasgow are to be offered 30 days "safe haven" in the city, this 30-day "reflection period" will offer them a chance to recover, receive medical assistance, legal guidance and counselling. Specialist teams including social workers, interpreters and housing officers have been created to offer assistance to foreign women who have been caught up in the sex trade. The 30-day reflection period is a core tenet of a recent Council of Europe directive on the trafficking of human beings, although the UK government has not sign ed up to the directive.

Sultan Azlan Shah of Perak who is the former Lord President of the Malaysia Federal Court, said nations needed to draw up comprehensive laws to stop the trafficking of women and children, and

humans as a whole, and at the same time protect the victims of this crime. "These laws must impose just punishment to the traffickers while the victims must be given adequate shelter...without these comprehensive laws, victims are made out as criminals," he said. Sultan Azlan Shah said many nations, including Malaysia, had not adopted a set of comprehensive laws to curb human trafficking and protecting the victims. At the same time, he said, bilateral and multilateral cooperation between countries was needed to eradicate this crime.

UNICEF to continue to energetically combat the crime of cross-border trafficking

A UNICEF expert recently stated that UNICEF must continue to energetically combat the crime of cross-border trafficking in Ningming County, in Guangxi. Illegal border crossings and illegal marriage and/or illegal labour migration and other forms of illegal activities in the border areas are gradually increasing. UNICEF will this year spend 110,000CNY on implementing activities of the 'Anti Crossborder Trafficking of Women and Children' project. The UNICEF expert was impressed with the use of 'Anti-trafficking' folk songs in the Zhuang language as a form of information dissemination in Ningming County.

Yunnan Public Security Agencies rescue over 2,000 trafficked women and children over five years

During the Fourth Provincial Meeting on Women and Children in Yunnan, the Yunnan Public Security Agencies announced that in the course of combating the crime of trafficking of women and children that they had rescued over 2,000 trafficked women and children over the last five years. According to the Yunnan Provincial Police Department, across the province from 2001 until the present there have been over 1,794 cases of trafficking of women and children uncovered, 4,411 suspects apprehended, and 2,179 trafficked women and children rescued. According to incomplete statistics, from the beginning of this year the Provincial Public Security Agencies have smashed 187 cases of cross-border trafficking: there have been 256 suspects apprehended, which includes 42 from Vietnam, 5 from Lao, and 37 from Myanmar, and there have been 590 trafficked women and children rescued, including nationals from Vietnam, Lao, Myanmar, as well as China.

英国内务部已授予格拉斯哥市政府一项对普通移民条例的豁免,尽管,这项授权有违目前的内务部相关政策。该市对在格拉斯哥市的卖淫场所进行搜查时所发现的被拐卖者提供一个为期30天的"安全避难所",这个30天的"反省期"将为他们提供一个康复、获得医疗救助、法律指导与咨询的机会。社会救助工作者、翻译和内务部官员所组成的专家团队对在非法性交易中获救的外国妇女提供救助。为期30天的反省期是日前欧洲理事会针对打击人口拐卖的指导意见的一项核心内容,然而英国还未签署这项指导意见。

马来西亚联邦法院贵族院长,毗叻城的苏丹 Azlan Shah 说,各国需要起草综合性的法律来阻止拐卖妇女儿童,即拐卖人口,同时保护这一罪行的受害者。他说:"这些法律应当对人口贩子施以公正的惩罚,而对受害者必须提供足够的庇护。没有这些全面性的法律,受害者就会会被当作罪犯。" 苏丹 Azlan Shah 说,包括马来西亚在内的许多国家没有采用一整套综合性的法律来遏制人口拐卖和保护受害者。与此同时,要根除这一罪行就需要国家间的双边和多边合作。

记者从第四次云南省妇女儿童工作会议上获悉,云南省公安机关积极打击拐卖妇女儿童的犯罪行为,五年解救两千余名被拐卖妇女儿童。据云南省公安厅介绍,2001年以来全省公安机关共破获拐卖妇女儿童案件1794起,抓获拐卖犯罪嫌疑人4411名,解救被拐卖妇女儿童2179名。据不完全统计,近年来全省公安机关侦破跨国拐卖妇女儿童案件187起;抓获犯罪嫌疑人256名,其中越南籍42名,老挝籍5名,缅甸籍37名;解救越南籍、老挝籍、缅甸籍、中国籍被拐卖妇女儿童590名。
