Fujian police rescued 18 trafficked Vietnamese women

Dongnan News Web, 28 November 2008: According to information released by the Department of Public Security of Fujian province during its press conference on 27 November, the Bureau of Public Security of Yunxiao county uncovered trafficking in women from Vietnam through Yunnan, Guangxi and other provinces since the beginning of this year.

Eighteen Vietnamese women were trafficked successively to the Yunxiao county of Fujian province by the group of suspects. The women were then on-sold for RMB \pm 20,000 to \pm 30,000 each to remote mountainous areas. A profit of around RMB \pm 1000-2500 had been made on each of the women.

Life News, 28 November 2008: More than 160 staff from provincial Women's Federation participated in the training workshop for the *Implementation Plans on the Law of the P.R. China on the Protection of Rights and Interests of Women for the Yunnan Province.* The participants were to learn about the new Implementation Plans, the *Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women* and the *Convention on the Rights*

of the Child during the 2-day workshop.

According to the Vice Chairwoman of the Women's Federation, ten Children's Activity Centres will be built in Yunnan and Guangxi provinces. In addition, appropriate, community-based children protection mechanisms will be established in 75% of the 37 major project sites in source areas, while in destination and transit areas, protection mechanisms targeting domestic and cross-border migrant children will be set up in 75% of the 33 major project sites.

Gansu Daily, 28 November 2008: Gansu province will implement its provincial *Plan of Action on Combating Trafficking in Women and Children* this year. It aims to achieve comprehensive management in trafficking hotspots by 2012. The province will also establish an Inter-Departmental Joint Conference System.

For the rescued women and minors over 16 years of age who are unable or unwilling to return to their places of origin, relevant departments will help to provide appropriate vocational skills training, career advice and other services in order to enable them to find work outside their places of origin. For those women and children who are to be repatriated, work will be done in their families and communities in order to help them solve practical problems in their daily lives.

World Congress III Against the Sexual Exploitation of Children was held in Brazil http://www.crin.org/violence/search/closeup.asp?infoID=18144

Child Rights Information Network, 26 November 2008: World Congress III Against the Sexual Exploitation of Children, co-sponsored by UNICEF, the Brazilian Government, ECPAT, the NGO Group on the CRC and others, was held on 25 November in Rio de Janeiro, the capital of Brazil. Nearly 3,000 participants from over 125 countries gathered to exchange experiences on combating sexual exploitation of children during the 4-day conference.

The conference looked at sexual exploitation in the family, child marriage, sexual exploitation of child domestic labourers, the commercial sex industry, child pornography and sexual exploitation of children in cyberspace. It also looked at strategies for combating non-commercial forms of child sexual exploitation, including the sexual exploitation of children in their homes, by religious leaders, teachers, peacekeepers and armed groups in war zones.

东南新闻网, 2008 年 11 月 28 日: 昨日上午,记者从福建省公安厅新闻发布会上了解到,今年初以来,云霄县公安局在追捕在逃人员吴某的过程中发现,云霄县和平乡通贝村的张某等人伙同吴某经云南、广西等地,将多名越南籍妇女拐至云霄。

经审理,该团伙从 2008 年 1 月开始,先后将 18 名越南籍女青年拐卖到云霄县,再以每人 2 万至 3 万元的价格卖到偏远山区,每拐卖一名妇女获利 1000~2500 元不等。

生活新报,2008年11月28日:来自全省妇联系统的160余名工作人员齐聚一堂,参加了《云南省实施<中华人民共和国妇女权益保障法>办法》培训班。在为期两天的培训期内,她们将学习新的实施办法和《消除对妇女一切形式歧视公约》和《儿童权利公约》。

昆明市妇联陈副主席介绍,接下来将在云南和广西两地建立 10 个儿童活动中心,其中 3 个在流出地 37 个主要项目点 75%的地方建立起合适的、以社区为基础的儿童保护机制;在流入地和流经地 33 个主要项目点 75%的地方,针对在国内流动和跨境流动的儿童,实施适当的保护模式。

对于被解救妇女儿童中,不能或不愿意回原住地的妇女和 16 周岁以上的未成年人,相关部门将帮助她们获得相应职业技能培训、职业指导等就业服务,最终达到异地就业。对要回归社会的被解救妇女儿童,要做好其家庭和所在社区工作,帮助其解决实际生活问题。

里约热内卢大会将讨论的问题包括: 儿童婚姻、童工性剥削、商业性行业、儿童色情及网络上的儿童性剥削。大会还将关注儿童被亲属、老师、维和人员、武装分子等性剥削的问题。
